2023-2024 Helen P. Denit Financial Awards

The Helen P. Denit Honors Program is pleased to announce the availability of financial awards to support a variety of enriching educational experiences for Helen P. Denit Honors students.

Eligibility for awards:

- Denit Honors students must:
 - o have been enrolled in the Helen P. Denit Honors Program for a minimum of one semester before the activity to be eligible.
 - Be in good academic standing (GPA of 3.3 or higher).
 - Be able to provide supporting documentation (such as receipts or supervisor paperwork) to obtain reimbursement.
 - List a faculty sponsor (a professor, research mentor) to serve as a reference in support of your application.

Other considerations:

- Priority will be given to students who are actively engaged in the Honors Program (are on track
 to take the required number of enhanced courses before they graduate and have attended two
 co-curricular events per semester).
- The Honors Council will take student conduct, completion of required elements of the activity, and adherence to all rules, regulations, and standards of conduct of The University of Baltimore into consideration when making award decisions. Students traveling abroad agree to abide by the laws of the country including but not limited to laws governing the use of alcohol and drugs.

The Honors Council will evaluate applications and make decisions shortly after the application deadlines. However, this monetary support will only be available *after* students participate in the specified activities. Honors students are only eligible to receive *one Denit Financial Award during their studies at The University of Baltimore*.

At the end of the semester, all student awardees are required to submit a three-page narrative essay (including pictures if appropriate) summarizing the ways in which the experience shaped their perspective on global issues, culture, and/or their personal and professional goals. This essay should be emailed to Dr. Farley at sfarley@ubalt.edu. Recipients of Research Awards may also be required to present their research in a formal presentation to members of the UBalt and honors communities.
